

**Read Your Voicemail Messages Any Time, Any Where;

Jesse commented to James, "Wouldn't it be easier if you could just read and delete your voicemail like e-mail?" and with that, SimulScribe was born. At the time, James was developing voice recognition software and had a creative idea on how to transcribe messages. SimulScribe began beta of the product in December 2003.
